IS 2010: Revised ACM | AIS Guidelines for Undergraduate IS Programs...

The April 2010 CAIS article (Topi et al., 2010) proposes a revised information systems (IS) model curriculum that increases an IS program scope and flexibility to satisfy varied requirements from the changing business environment. The revised curriculum guidelines are adaptable for schools of business, public administration, and information science or informatics as well as stand-alone schools of Information Systems.

The IS 2010 curriculum is designed to educate and prepare graduates to enter the workforce equipped with the knowledge and skills specified over categories of IS specific, foundational, and domain fundamental. The curriculum separates core IS courses from career track electives, while providing a matrix that maps core and elective courses to career tracks. The authors identify and explain how the following seven core IS courses are requisites for any IS program:

- 1. Foundations of Information Systems
- 2. Data and Information Management
- 3. Enterprise Architecture
- 4. IS Project Management
- 5. IT Infrastructure
- 6. Systems Analysis & Design
- 7. IS Strategy, Management, and Acquisition

The authors propose that the joint ACM and AIS curriculum revision represents an effort to re-evaluate the core principles of the discipline through a very careful specification of degree learning outcomes. The high-level IS capabilities that the curriculum specifies as the highest level outcome expectations are:

- Improving organizational processes
- Exploiting opportunities created by technology innovations
- Understanding and addressing information requirements
- Designing and managing enterprise architecture
- Identifying and evaluating solution and sourcing alternatives
- · Securing data and infrastructure, and
- Understanding, managing and controlling IT risks.

The AMCIS 2010 schedule is online as an available link from the AIS website (http://amcis2010.abstractcentral.com/planner).
