Introduction

The purpose of research roundtables is to gain feedback from peers regarding in-process work, such as:

- 1. Concepts and ideas that you are considering for future study,
- 2. Ongoing research that you have not yet completed, and
- 3. Research questions and approaches that you would like advice on handling

For this reason, your descriptions should be brief and focused. Do not go into excessive detail in presenting your ideas and questions. *Mini-posters must not exceed 1 page in length*. You are not required to provide a mini-poster in order to register and participate in discussions in a research roundtable, however, providing one will aid roundtable hosts and other participants in understanding your work.

Mini-posters must be submitted as email attachments to <u>vancewilson@gmail.com</u> no later than July 31, 2012 in order to ensure that roundtable hosts have time to review them prior to the session.

Title of the study should be Arial 11pt, bold and section headings should be Arial 11pt bold. The author's names and other text should be listed in Times New Roman 11pt.

The introduction should briefly describe the problem domain and the research gap identified. References can be inserted as footnotes, but are not required. The section titles provided here are for your guidance; these may be modified to fit the needs of your presentation.

Research Questions / Models

The research question and research models used in the study should be presented in this section.

Methodology

Proposed research methodology should be briefly described here.

Contributions/Implications

The authors should include research contributions of the proposed study and/or the implications of their work to practice.

Challenges

In this section, authors should list up to three issues they would like the round table discussions to address regarding the research.
