Feature Articles...

President's Report... Vance Wilson

Every new year is full of promise, and I expect 2013 to be no exception. The best news for SIG-Health from my perspective is that we are now entering our second year under the new executive board structure that accompanied the 2012 revision of SIG bylaws. That means we are in the position to refine and improve our methods rather than undertaking every activity for the first time. Here is what has happened during the past three months.

February – An ad hoc Mission Committee was formed, following my call in January to develop a new SIG-Health Mission Statement. Members include past SIG chairs, Cindy LeRouge and Rich Klein, past Vice-Chair Monica Chiarini Tremblay, and President-Elect Gondy Leroy. Thanks to all for agreeing to participate in this project. After discussions with Rick Klein, in his role of AMCIS Coordinator, I have invited Surendra Sarnikar of Dakota State University to help Rich in this important job. The plan is for Surendra to learn about the process prior to AMCIS 2013 and he will then cochair the conference coordinator position in subsequent years. We welcome Surendra to the SIG-Health board.

March – Following several rounds of development, the Mission Committee proposed the following SIG-Health Mission Statement to the Executive Board for consideration:

The mission of SIG-Health is to support health-IS research, education, and career development in a manner that is inclusive of diverse research methodologies and topic areas, to interact productively with allied disciplines, and to promote high professional standards of ethics and collegiality.

April – Discussions involving a SIG-Health workshop at AMCIS 2013 resulted in the decision to not to proceed at this time. Plans are underway to host a joint workshop with SIGHCI at AMCIS 2014. The Executive Board approved the new Mission statement, with thanks to the ad hoc committee members. In addition Mike Dohan was asked to take over moderator duties for the AIS SIG-Health listsery. Thanks to Bengisu Tulu for managing this responsibility for the past several years. The board also acknowledges and thanks Terry Byrd, whose term as At-Large Director ended in March.

Upcoming SIG-Health Business Meeting – AMCIS is where we hold our annual business meeting, which is tentatively scheduled this year to run from 6-7pm on Friday, August 16 at the conference hotel. I hope to see you there!

New AHRQ guide identifies design methods for development of consumer health IT... Kenneth Satterfield

A new guide funded by the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) entitled "Designing Consumer Health IT: Lessons from the Design of Consumer Technologies—A Guide for Developers and Systems Designers" presents suggested recommendations for designers and developers of consumer health IT products. The ten recommendations included are either general guidance for designers and design teams that can be applied to the process of designing and developing a product; or specific to a design phase such as idea generation, identification of end users, testing and commercialization. The guide presents results of an environmental scan and grey literature review; and expert interviews to improve consumer health IT design in order to increase effective use of consumer health IT.
